What are your hours of operation?

Fort Collins and Wellington locations will be open Monday through Friday from 8:00am-5:30pm. The Loveland-Pulliam Club will be open Monday through Friday from 7:00am-6:00pm.

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How do I register?

Registration will open during the week of August 10th. To register, you can go to begreatlarimer.org to register online. You must register at the site you wish to attend.

What is the cost?

We recognize that these costs are higher than normal Boys & Girls Club membership fees. Due to our increased hours of operation and COVID-19 prevention measures, we are not able to keep our same low fees. The fees below will support the cost to put on this full-day remote learning option. **We have scholarships available as we do not want any child to be turned away due to inability to pay.**

For full-day remote learning support and enrichment activities:

- Part time, 1-3 days a week \$300 per month (\$75 per week, \$25 per day)
- Full time, 4-5 days a week \$500 per month (\$100 per week, \$25 per day)

******During the weeks of August 18-28, no fees will be charged.***

Do you provide financial assistance?

Yes, we will have limited full and partial scholarships available. If needed, parents can request a scholarship application upon registering their child/ren.

Does my current Boys & Girls Clubs membership apply?

No, all children, whether they have been Club members in the past or not, must register again. Additionally, families who are on waitlists must also re-register.

How will my child get to the Club?

There will be no transportation services provided at this time. Parents are responsible for getting their child to and from the Club locations each day.



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What does a typical full-day schedule look like to support student learning?

When schools begin virtual instruction, we will be prepared to help support student's learning throughout the day. Boys & Girls Clubs staff will provide space and time for students to get connected to their classroom instructor and will support students during lessons being instructed by their teachers, should they need assistance. We ask that all students come to the Club prepared for virtual learning. This means that they bring their devices, supplies needed, headphones and class schedule. We will serve students from multiple schools and will not be able to know or keep track of every student's schedule so it is imperative that students bring their schedule with them. Once instruction is done for the day, we will provide enrichment activities in the following areas:

- Arts
 - *Craft projects, drama and theater Clubs, etc.*
- Sports, fitness & recreation
 - *Sport leagues, games tournaments, etc.*
- Health & Life Skills
 - *Cooking classes, robotics, etc.*
- Character & Leadership Development
 - *Community service projects*
- Hands-on academic enrichment
 - *STEM projects, science experiments*

Will you provide meals?

Parents will have the option to send their child with meals, or breakfast and lunch will be provided. Note, this is subject to change based on our food distribution partners. Youth will also be given a snack once a day.

What extra safety precautions and checks do you have in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19?

We are working with the Larimer County Health Department and the Poudre School District to ensure that all COVID-19 safety regulations are followed. Youth will be asked to wear a mask indoors and practice social distancing at all times and wash their hands frequently. Upon arrival, youth's temperature will be taken and they will be asked a series of questions related to symptoms. Any youth that temps above 100.4 or experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, as listed by the CDC, will be sent home. Any symptoms will be monitored and if those symptoms are related to COVID-19 youth will be sent home. Youth sent home with a COVID-19 symptom must have a note from a health professional to return OR must be symptom free for 14 days before returning.
