

Boys & Girls Clubs School Year 2020-2021 FAQ

When and where will after school programming be available?

New Vision Charter School students will attend the Boys & Girls Club at the Loveland-Pulliam location at 2500 East 1st Street in Loveland, attached to New Vision Charter Elementary School (NVCS). Some Boys & Girls Clubs programming may also happen in NVCS classrooms.

What ages do you serve?

We serve youth ages 6-18 years old.

Will you be open for Middle School Students in an A/B Hybrid Schedule?

Yes, we will be open Monday through Friday 7:30 AM - 6:00 PM for middle school students. Middle school students will have the opportunity to do their virtual learning at Boys & Girls Clubs with staff assistance on the days that they are not scheduled for in-person learning.

What is the cost?

Below are our rates for after school programming. *Please note, there are no charges for middle and high school students to attend.*

- Part time, 1-3 days a week \$175 per month
- Full time, 4-5 days a week \$300 per month
- Full-day programming (school out days), \$35 per day

How do payments work?

Payments are made on a monthly basis and must be prepaid by the **5th of each month**. For example, your monthly payment for childcare in September must be paid by September 5th. Parents will be able to make payments online through a parent portal using credit card or account transfer. Auto-pay can also be set up to assist with automatic withdrawals. Parents that would like to make payments in person using cash or check can do so by visiting their Club location during operating hours. Parents wishing to join the Club in the middle of the month or billing cycle can receive a prorated amount.

Do you provide financial assistance?

Yes, we will have limited full and partial scholarships available. If you are in need of financial assistance, please fill out a scholarship form after registration, one will be attached in your Welcome packet. Scholarship requests can take up to two business days to process.

What does a typical full-day and after school program schedule look like?

For students who are attending Boys & Girls Clubs for virtual instruction, we are prepared to help support student's learning throughout the day. Boys & Girls Clubs staff will provide space and time for students to get connected with their classroom instructor and will support students during lessons, should they need assistance. We ask that all students come to the Club prepared for virtual learning. All students need to bring their devices, supplies needed, headphones and class schedule.

During our after school program, we will provide a wide variety of enrichment activities including:

- Arts
 - Craft projects, drama and theater Clubs, etc.
- Sports, fitness & recreation
 - Sport leagues, games tournaments, etc.
- Health & Life Skills
 - Cooking classes, robotics, etc.
- Character & Leadership Development
 - Community service projects
- Hands-on academic enrichment
 - STEM projects, science experiments

Will you provide meals and snacks?

Yes, we will provide lunch every day at 11 AM and snacks each day after school.

What extra safety precautions and checks do you have in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19?

We are working with the Larimer County Health Department to ensure that all COVID-19 safety regulations are followed. Youth will be asked to wear a mask indoors and practice social distancing at all times and wash their hands frequently. Upon arrival, youth's temperature will be taken and they will be asked a series of questions related to symptoms. Any youth that



temps above 100.4 or experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, as listed by the CDC, will be sent home. Any symptoms will be monitored and if those symptoms are related to COVID-19 youth will be sent home. Youth or staff sick with COVID like symptoms are to have a doctor's note or a negative COVID-19 test to return, they also must be symptom free to return.
