What are the different options, specific to Loveland?

Youth Entering Grades 1 through 4	Have the option to attend Winona, Mary Blair, or Sarah Milner
Youth Entering Grade 5	May attend either Winona, Mary Blair, Sarah Milner OR the Loveland-Pulliam Boys & Girls Club
Youth Entering Grades 6 and Higher	Have the option to attend the Loveland-Pulliam location, 2500 East 1st Street

Where do I register?

Please visit our website www.begreatlarimer.org to register online. At the top of the page, click on “Join a Club” and register at the site you wish to attend. If your children will attend two separate locations, two separate forms must be filled out.

What is the cost?

For Fort Collins, Loveland Pulliam and the Wellington locations, there is a \$100 one-time registration fee. After that, families are asked to consider a donation if that is possible for them. The actual cost to BGCLC to provide this summer program is \$2,000, per child. To keep costs low, families who are able, are encouraged to donate. Club Thompson (Loveland Elementary School-based sites) will follow a separate fee model.

How do payments work?

Families will have the following options to pay for their one-time registration fee. Families can make their selection when registering their child/ren through Procure.

- Pay in full - Payment is due by the 1st of the following month
- Pay in three installments - Payments are due the 1st of each month
- Scholarship - Please contact your Club Director for more information. Registration will not be confirmed until you have contacted your Club Director

Do you provide other financial assistance?

If you are unable to afford these fees, we offer both partial and full scholarships. To apply, families need to fill out a scholarship application and submit it to their Club Director.

What does a typical day look like?

Upon arriving at Club, your child will be greeted by staff and will join their group for a day of fun and enriching programs, including:

- Arts
 - *Craft projects, drama and theater Clubs, etc.*
- Sports, fitness & recreation
 - *Sport leagues, games tournaments, etc.*
- Health & Life Skills
 - *Cooking classes, robotics, etc.*
- Character & Leadership Development
 - *Community service projects*
- Hands-on academic enrichment
 - *STEM projects, science experiments*



Will you provide meals?

Parents will have the option to send their child with meals, or lunch and snack will be provided by the Food Bank for Larimer County at no additional charge.

**Due to funding, the Sage Homes Wellington Club will not be eligible for this and families will need to provide meals for their children.

What extra safety precautions and checks do you have in place to prevent the spread of COVID-19?

We are working with the Larimer County Health Department and the School District to ensure that all COVID-19 safety regulations are followed. Youth will be asked to wear a mask indoors, to practice social distancing at all times, and to wash their hands frequently. Upon arrival, youth's temperature will be taken and they will be asked a series of questions related to COVID-19 symptoms. Any youth that has a temperature above 100.4 or is experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms, as listed by the CDC, will be sent home. Any symptoms that arise during the day will be monitored and if those symptoms are related to COVID-19 youth will be sent home. Youth sent home with any COVID-19 symptoms must have a note from a health professional to return OR must be symptom free for 14 days before returning.
