SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT In Elementary and Middle School Children

Spirituality and a Child's Adjustment

In public schools the role of religion is diminished or excluded from most discussions and analyses of a child's social adjustment. At EVCS, we teach children that spiritual faith is highly valued and the children come to recognize that religion has an important impact on their lives. Unfortunately, many people today only see spiritual faith and prayer as a mere coping mechanism. However, research supports findings that higher levels of religious involvement influence greater wellbeing and mental health. In addition, religious practices have been found to serve as a source of strength.

The Value of Spiritual Development

Spiritual development embeds significant value systems into children that affect the way they feel, think, and behave. At the societal level, economic and cultural changes are related to a (debated) loss of significance of both religion and the family in many societies. At EVCS, we believe family is the place where major socialization activities take place for children and these activities play an important role in a child's development.

One study found fact that today's youth who are religiously devoted had a significantly decreased likelihood of participation in a variety of substance use behaviors as well as decreases in the likelihood of fighting and theft. Many studies find that spiritual development has important implications in terms of youth involvement in problem behavior. The implication is that problem behavior in young people can be associated with a lack of spiritual development.

Nurturing and Nourishing Today's Youth

At EVCS, as educators we treat colleagues and children well, we intentionally provide a good example for children, and use contemplative practices when connecting with nature. We believe opportunities for creative expression and free play, engagement with nature, contemplative practices (e.g. mindfulness), relationship building and moral/character development are all related to nurturing and nourishing a child's spirituality.
