In this time in World history it is imperative that we distinguish what is cultural and what is truly Christ like. What does our King require of us? When Jesus was asked by an "expert in the law" how to inherit eternal life, He replied "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul with all your

strength, and with all your mind and your neighbor as yourself." (**Luke 10:27**) That is the strongest characteristic of Kingdom culture—that we love our king. How do we do that? Jesus said to love our neighbor as ourselves. We may not understand our neighbor's culture but we are mandated to love and respect them. Lord, show us how to love a neighbor of another culture well this week.
