We have a parade scheduled for Johnstown on 2 June. This is an early morning outing, hope to see everyone there. See you at the next meeting, June 28th.


ENGLEWOOD SHRINE CLUB

Chapin Blake reported that he has moved to a new facility in Golden. The Blakes volunteered for many years delivering magazines to Lutheran Hospital.



We have a very busy summer so keep up on all the activities in the Red Fez. Remember we are all Masons first, keep it on the square and on the level.


