

To support new members in understanding the value of Shrine membership, our Chief Aide, Don Myers, received direction to finalize his recommended "Candidates Ceremonial Gift" and submit to the Divan for approval. IS Rich Silver, SLC/SHC Board Member reported that the Salt Lake City Hospital has received Top Hospital recognition for six continuous years in US News Report. A Patient Advisory Council has been established with Patient parents as members. Ninety percent of the staff have been fully vaccinated for COVID. Ten percent were infected. Working on research for 2 ½ year old and under wheelchairs. IS Rich also stated that SLC/SHC is working jointly with other area hospitals for needed surgery. The Salt Lake Hospital as well as the others are all exceeding expectations in providing holistic care to our "Shrine Kids."

The highlight for the evening was our guest speaker, Tamera Wong who, with her husband, have four children and have adopted seven children requiring a variety of care provided at Shriner Hospitals for Children. Her presentation was absolutely inspiring. Many of the children came from orphanages in China. These children had no hope for a good or any kind of life in their homeland. The Wongs, through tenacity and hard work, brought handicapped children to their home and made them a valued family member. Everyone has been successful in their own way and are becoming active, contributing members of our American society. If you did not have the opportunity to view this astounding presentation, look for Tamera Wong on the internet. Amazing! Do thank Chris and Judy Weymouth for bringing Tamera's life's endeavor to us. What a story.

IS Ron recognized all the El Jebel nobles that have been members for 10 years. There were over a dozen. He also highlighted the Medical Staff for March and called on IS Denis Proctor, Director, to provide a history of the unit beginning in 1950 with two doctors. It has grown from just doctors to any El Jebel Noble who wants to work in the field of medical care.

Looking to the future, the Imperial Session is scheduled to take place in Houston on 3-8 July 2021. Many nobles and ladies are already planning to attend, and the invitation is open to all.







El Jebel seems to be blessed with several true heroes, one of whom has been eulogized early on in this column. Another such Noble is Bruce Hepp. One of the few true native Coloradoans, Bruce was the third generation of Denverites, born in 1934, the next of a long line of Hepps, Coloradoans all since 1884. Graduating from Denver's East High School (where he met his dear wife Marylyn) in 1953, Bruce then matriculated to the University of Denver where he enrolled in the ROTC program which led to his joining the Air Force after graduating with a degree in mechanical engineering in 1957.

Bruce flew rescue helicopters in Vietnam. There are many Air Force pilots out there who owe their life to this man, recipient of the Silver Star and three Distinguished Flying Crosses. (One could listen to his war stories for hours and be totally enthralled.) Once while in Vietnam, he was the second helicopter to arrive at a pilot-rescue scene and had to pick up the original pilot and some survivors of the first helicopter that had been shot down. But he is very happy to report that he never put a scratch on his aircraft, although the enemy put a lotta bullet holes in it.

He left the Air Force after nine fun-filled years, as a major, and started flying for United Airlines. He was the senior first-officer in the fleet, and therefore had his choice of routes. He used that status to bid for routes which would allow him to be home on weekends, thereby ensuring lots of time with his wife and children Alan, Valorie, and Victoria (Vicky). Bruce is proud of his three children, four grandchildren, and 2 great-granddaughters (and soon to be great-grandson). He retired from United after 25 years.

His Masonic journey started when he had his father be his first-line signer for Union #7. His uncle, who had been initiated in 1927, was Worshipful Master and raised him in 1959, thanks to special consideration to do so during a month-long furlough from over-seas duty with the Air Force. He and Marylyn were very active as Bethel Guardians for Job's Daughters where he met our present Potentate III. Sir Ron Williamson, and his wife Robyn, whose daughter Michele was a member. Bruce joined Rocky Mountain Consistory (now Denver Consistory) and then El Jebel in November 1973. Among his other accomplishments he was in the Jeep Patrol for twentyfive years and then tried out the RV Roamers. While on a trip to Moab, he recalled his expertise learned as a rescue pilot in Nam. Fred Mays and some others from the Jeep Patrol had gone over to Moab a little early to check out some jeep trails. Fred had to use the winch on his jeep to get some other jeeps up a hill. When he was unhooking the last jeep, his emergency brake released and pinned him between the two jeeps and crushed his pelvis. Hearing a call for help on the CB radio, Bruce answered the call, found out the situation, and called for medical help

from a nearby home. Bruce was informed that it would take an ambulance several hours to get there. Knowing that his friend would not last that long, Bruce cajoled those on the other end of the line to send a helicopter to take his friend to the hospital. Through his persistence, they finally relented and sent the chopper. Just add one more rescue to his list.

He had lectured at a Parker school on Military Day, counts woodworking and old cars among his hobbies. Bruce tells of a monument down at the Air Force Academy dedicated to his old group in Nam – the Air Rescue Service. Seems as how there is also a book out about the esteemed group, in which he is prominently mentioned, entitled *Naked Fanny*, a reference to how those pilots felt going in to hot zones to pick up fellow fliers.

Didja know that he comes by all these military heroics naturally – he claims ancestry (on his mother's side) to none other than Admiral Dewey? For those not up on Naval History, George Dewey was Admiral of the Navy, the only person in United States history to have attained the rank. He is best known for his victory at the Battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish–American War, with the loss of only a single crewman on the American side.


