Testing

In the Spring Newsletter I explained a little about what the test structure is for our club and for US Figure Skating. A test session is when our club hosts official US Figure Skating judges at our rink and they volunteer their time to judge whether a skater has advanced their skating skills enough to pass a certain level of skating. Our club holds test sessions about once a month and a skater can register to take a test when their coach feels their skills are ready to perform before a US Figure Skating judging panel. There are 4 primary areas that skaters can test their skating skills, moves in the field, free skate, dance, and pairs skating. Skaters and their parents should work with their coach when deciding about readiness to test. Testing registration is found on Entryeze. It is an adjunct website to US Figure Skating that clubs use. 
2021 Colorado Basic Skill Series Champion



EPIC Productions Rehearsals Underway for the 2022 Season

EPIC Productions, the FCFSC showcase ensemble team, has begun summer rehearsals in preparation for the National Showcase competition being held in Wesley Chapel, Florida in August. Its 20 members, lead by coaches Marianne Strobel, Denaysa Sisemore, and Lisa Moore, are working on refining their large production number "Sweet Dreams" after a successful performance at the club's Ice Extravaganza in May.

The team is also preparing three mini-ensembles of 6 to 7 skaters each, including a song from the musical 9 to 5, based on the Dolly Parton movie; a scene from the musical Something Rotten about a fictitious rival to Shakespeare who loves musicals; and a mini based on an original concept developed by coaches that honors important women in history. Many skaters are also preparing individual programs to compete in categories such as Choreographic Artistry, Lyrical Pop, Character Performance, and duets.

In May, the group's Team Captains and coordinators for costumes, props, team spirit, and social media were selected through an application process. These roles provide skaters with valuable opportunities to develop their leadership skills and assist coaches in leading warm-ups, developing costumes and props, helping with rehearsal feedback, and coordinating fundraising and other events. Thank you, skaters, for stepping up and offering your hard work!

As part of rehearsal and fundraising, EPIC Productions will hold a public exhibition performance of all the ensembles at the end of July, as well as some other events during the summer. So keep an eye out for announcements about how you can see them in action and support the team!
