



Watershed Restoration/Forest Health Initiative for Creek Week 2020 at Sondermann Park



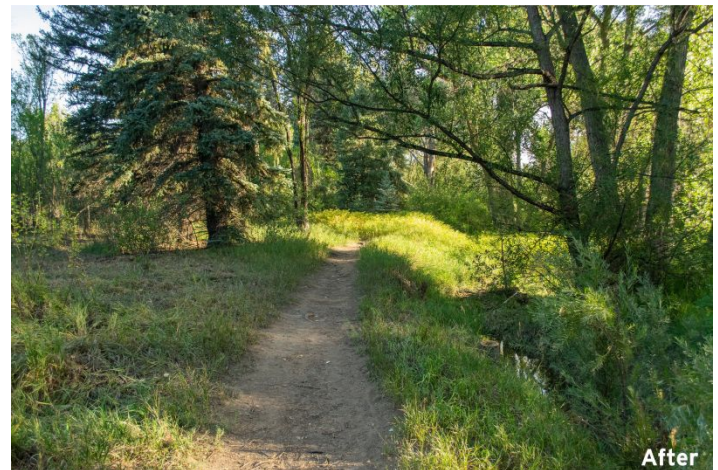
What: A volunteer opportunity to remove invasive species along Mesa Creek in Sondermann Park as an activity during Creek Week.

Why: A healthy forest is critical for a healthy watershed. Sondermann Park is one of hundreds of locations within the Fountain Creek Watershed that has been taken over by non-native, invasive trees including Siberian elm, Russian olive, Green ash, and Honeysuckles. These invasive species outcompete native vegetation which negatively impacts our native wildlife!

Who: The City of Colorado Springs Parks, Recreation and Cultural Services staff, Creek Week Steering Committee members, and you!

*Volunteers must adhere to State and Local guidelines for COVID-19, sign waivers, and be twelve years of age or older.

Where: Sondermann Park - west of I-25 and north of Uintah Street off Chestnut. **Park at Buena Ventura Street entrance - street parking.**
