Where Is Real Security?

We're astonished by the ways that we say we love God above all else but so easily slip into various forms of idolatry. We're astonished that Jesus, through his teaching on the way to the cross, makes our lives more difficult rather than easier. Perhaps most of all, we're astonished that Jesus believes that limited, naturally idolatrous folk like us can, with God's help, be faithful to such a demanding teacher! Once we killed for "liberty, equality, and fraternity," now it's "security." Once we had the integrity, as a nation, to call it the War Department, later the Department of Defense, now it's become, "Homeland Security." The Christian faith has always taught that there is no security that does not come from God.

The United States is spending about \$500 billion on security, a larger military budget than all other nations combined. Biblical scholar Richard Hays says this huge expenditure suggests that we are undertaking "a kind of programmatic commitment to salvation through violence and military force. We are a very fearful people, and we are putting our trust in swords and chariots and guns to somehow secure our well-being." We are attempting to accomplish through dollars and bombs that which Christians expect of God.

PRAYER NET

In his book, The Colors of Hope: Becoming People of Mercy, Justice, and Love, Richard Dahlstrom calls Christians to an intentional goal of blessing the lives of others in our midst. We are to be the artists who bring color into a world that is, too often, seen as gray. God gives each of us the tools we need to spread His love, whether it be in grand endeavors or in the actions of our everyday life.

In 2016, the Disciple Life Class became the artists by laying down a canvas of gray as we studied this inspirational book. As we progressed, we added color and symbols of hope, culminating with the addition of a prayer net. This piece of art is on display in Fellowship Hall.

The prayer net was inspired by the one in Ely Cathedral in Ely, England. Recognizing that Jesus called ordinary fishermen to follow him, this net symbolizes that God calls ordinary people to proclaim the good news that Christ brought with Him and it is to ordinary people that God blesses with His love when they call upon His Name. Take a minute to tie a string on the net, and, if you wish, write a prayer request on one of the tags provided and tie it to the net. Visit this net often, to watch as it transforms into a colorful expression of the artistry of God's people as we offer up our joys, cares, and concerns to Him.

PATHWAYS KIDS


