Gary's Story

Gary has been a client at HNS for several years. He is a cancer survivor and due to his severe illness and treatment, Gary became unemployed and homeless. As a result of his cancer, Gary has several health issues and receives disability benefits. HNS has helped Gary walk through some of his darkest hours. We have provided much needed special medical assistance and other supportive services. During Gary's homeless experience, he suffered from frost bite which turned into gangrene. He was scheduled to have several toes amputated and came to HNS to receive some food. Knowing that his living situation was not adequate for him to recover, we were able to provide motel assistance during his time of recovery. HNS also partnered with Meals on Wheels to bring him warm meals while he was recuperating. Gary said, "I am so grateful for being safe, warm, and dry."

Our van is going places! It transports homeless parents and children to churches for overnight shelter and then brings them back to the Life Center in the morning so they can start a hard day of working toward self-sufficiency. Our van transports weary, cold, and hungry homeless adults to inclement weather shelter in the winter. It even takes a struggling homeless veteran to a disability hearing so that his life can forever be changed. Help us purchase a new van! \$10,000

Graduates of our Angel House program have worked tirelessly for months to break down barriers to self-sufficiency, pay off debt, and obtain good jobs. Bless these families by helping HNS give them a home in transitional housing so that they can continue on the right path. I came into Angel House, a homeless family program of House of Neighborly Service, due to an unfortunate life circumstance concerning my disabled daughter and her 1½ year old son. It turned out to be a blessing in disguise. I needed help to provide for my family. At first



I thought the program wouldn't work for us but my family's safety was my first priority, so I agreed to the requirements. I found that the program helped me more than I ever dreamed. We were able to save money that I would have otherwise spent on gas and housing.

I met so many wonderful people in the churches that it filled my heart with gratitude. We were treated with respect and kindness. The Angel House staff was and continues to be, very supportive and encouraging. We were always made to feel comfortable, as if the house (Day Center) were our home. They gave us emotional support and made us feel even stronger and more determined to change our situation. I know that without Angel House and the people who work there, I wouldn't be where I am today. My family has obtained Section 8 housing, I have secured a great job, and we are getting on our feet again. I want to help others who are in need and am currently serving Angel House families as a member of my church.

I will be forever grateful to Angel House, the churches, and HNS. I believe in Angel House and everything that it stands for.

Becoming homeless was a very devastating time for us, but it turned into a true blessing. I have become a stronger and better woman because of it. Thank you Angel House staff for caring so much!
