From Pastor Ruth Ann

Community and Safety Team Update:

King of Glory's Community and Safety Team continues to meet. The in-person **Sunday morning Coffee Hour** is going well with about 15-20 people coming each Sunday. People sit socially distanced under the shade in the circle drive, bringing their own coffee and chairs. Anyone is welcome to attend! **9:00-10:00am.**

We have ordered new cleaning products that will help Darrell keep our spaces sanitized and clean. One product is back-ordered until September, but we are looking into others as well. When those come we are hopeful to welcome small groups back into the building a couple of days apart.

For the month of July, we will continue to suspend in-person worship per Bishop Gonia and the Rocky Mountain Synod Council recommendations. If we came for worship we would not be able to sing together or have very much spoken liturgy due to coronavirus spreading through droplets. Scientific experts say there are many people who are asymptomatic. We would all need to wear masks for the protection and care of our community.

Therefore we believe that the worship through our pre-recorded services are offering a better experience than we could have in person. Respondents to the survey were split half and half on their desire to come to worship vs staying home. That being said, we will continue to monitor the data and recommendations from the county and state.

We fully realize the grief and loss that comes with not being able to worship together. The team holds that in tension with the reality of a virus that is still present and is a health danger. Please be patient. There will be a day when we all can worship again together in the sanctuary!

Our gospel reading for the first weekend in July comes from the gospel of Matthew, chapter 11. Jesus says, ²⁸ "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

In this summer season I hope that you are able to find some rest from your burdens. Perhaps you aren't able to travel or do the things in your own neighborhood that you usually do in the summer due to COVID-19. So this summer is - and will be - different.

An Update from Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp

June 9, 2020 - Dear Sky Ranch Community,
We are living in challenging and uncertain times that call on us to be wise, flexible, faithful, and resilient. **Last week, after prayerful and thoughtful discussion, the Sky Ranch Board of Directors made the difficult decision to suspend all summer programs for 2020 and keep the site closed through August 7.**

We know people will be disappointed in this decision, but hope you understand that we grieve this loss with you. Our concern is to keep everyone safe and healthy, as well as our desire to be financially responsible with the long-term mission of this ministry. The risk is too high in a residential camp community setting for people to be exposed to this virus. **Parents trust us with their most valuable possession, their children, and we do not take that lightly.**

This decision has been a painful one. But as faithful followers of Christ, we are called to put our trust in God and not be afraid or discouraged. We are not forsaken; we are in a time of opportunity and innovation. Sky Ranch is determined to be a light in this darkness that seems so overwhelming.

Hear the Good News! Sky Ranch is doing ministry! Our summer staff is hired and has been doing training via Zoom since May 20! Equipping and empowering our summer staff to serve is our mission. **We believe this is a vital investment in the present and future leadership of our church, providing them with fresh opportunities to foster faith.**

Our Summer Staff are determined to provide resources that support our campers and congregations. Our goal is to get our staff up to camp, provide a safe place for them to continue their leadership development, and to create faith formation experiences. Sunday Adult Education - Class about Race Discrimination: June 28, July 5 & 12

Last Sunday, June 21, KOG began its second class about race discrimination. In the winter of 2019 we held our first class with about 15 people. We begin the conversation again, trying to see through new lenses. God in the book of Genesis intentionally made creation with an abundance of diversity. "Birds of every kind, fish of every kind...and God saw that it was Good!"

We ourselves, might not live in racially mixed neighborhoods. We might not have many experiences with people of multiple skin tones. For some of us, we've travelled and lived in places where Caucasians are the minority, or we have friends or family members who are not white. We can only bring to the conversation our own experience and current understanding. What we do then, is try to see life through another's eyes.

What is racism? Power + privilege. What is institutional power? What is white privilege? Can good people still do and say racist things without even knowing it? We take up these questions in a space that is first and foremost faith based: God created all people in God's image. And God saw that it was good. Come and join in the conversation through Zoom by phone or computer. We only learn as we talk together....and that is very good!

A Litany of Reconciliation

Coventry Cathedral was bombed and destroyed in 1948 and behind the cross "Father Forgive" was inscribed. Canon Joseph Poole in 1958 wrote the Litany of Reconciliation that "evokes us to approach sins and weaknesses in the forgiveness of God's love." In 1965 America's most prodigious composer (over 1500 compositions), Duke Ellington, set the Litany to music in "Father Forgive," as part of his second Sacred Concert. From jazz standards to musicals to opera, Ellington wrote for all genres, but regarded the Sacred Concerts as "the most important thing I have ever done." Beginning July 19, we will be sharing in Ellington's important work, using the Litany of Reconciliation as part of our service. Ellington thought of himself as a "messenger boy" using the Litany "to deliver a lyrical sermon," of confession, and asking for "forgiveness" in both text and music.
