From Pastor Ruth Ann



KOG Community Safety Team Works from a Place of Your Health: Update (Safety Team members: Eric Backsen, Judy Richardson, Ted Schmidt, Darrell Phelps, Pastors Ruth Ann and Deb) It's challenging to be church right now. Church is a place where we

gather to worship, pray, sing, and speak. Unfortunately, the virus loves those activities! When droplets from our speech or singing are expelled, the disease is also expelled if one is carrying it. Our highest goal is to keep you, God's people safe. Even if you've already had the virus, even if you're vaccinated or not vaccinated, the Safety Team desires us to live with Jesus' highest command to, "Love your neighbor."

Loving can be fun but loving consists of making choices for the betterment of our children, our spouses, our parents, our neighbors. Therefore, at times, loving isn't too fun, it's challenging, or even really hard! To put someone else first before ourselves goes against human nature. That's why we sometimes spell sin with a capital I, sIn. Our sIn, drives us always towards putting me or "I" first. That's sin.

Young children up to age 12 cannot be vaccinated. There is hope that will come later this fall. As your pastor, I cannot, in good conscience, put the littlest of God's children at more risk than adults who can chose to be vaccinated or not. We must mask around them.

Seniors continue to be more vulnerable as well. Their wisdom is a gift to our church, and older bodies take longer to heal when injured. We've already lost a couple of members to Covid. The Safety Team and I want to protect seniors.

Looking at attendance numbers, some members have returned, and some have not. Members and friends are still watching pre-recorded worship from the safety of their own homes. This is why we are

giving you options. The Safety Team wants to meet you where you are: physically, emotionally and psychologically. This virus attacks all of three of those aspects of our lives. While we cannot give you certainty about the future of this disease, the Safety Team can give you clarity about your involvement when you walk in the church doors.

Therefore due to the increased cases and rising infection rates of Covid in Larimer County, the Safety team is now requiring that masks be worn in the building.

Here are the new protocols:

- Masks will be worn in the building.
- Holy Communion: Pastors and servers will mask to serve you. Pre-packaged elements are still available for communing at your seat
- Outside worship will continue through September as long as weather is reasonable.
- If you wish to sing along when we are outside, put a mask on.
- Donuts and coffee will be served outside for the next several weekends.

The Safety Team fully realizes that these decisions will be welcomed by some and not welcomed by others. If we are loving one-another, then we make sacrifices for the other, based on God's love. Church is the space where God's love is proclaimed for all....and all people are cared for. I ask you to love one another. To think not of the "I" but of the "We". It's what King of Glory does so well! Let's keep loving and may God have the glory for our choices. Walking it with you, Pastor Ruth Ann

What is L2F2? If you've never heard of this ministry please read on! L2F2 stands for Loveland Lutheran Faith Formation and it is a partnership between King of Glory, Trinity and Zion Lutheran churches in Loveland. Pastors from all three congregations meet together each month to plan

youth activities such as Girl Talk, Man Cave, Middle School Fun events, high school events, service opportunities, retreats, youth gatherings, summer trips, and camp experiences.

Because of this partnership our youth have the opportunity to gather together for fellowship and fun with a group of youth from all over Loveland and beyond. For our middle school youth this means being in a group of 25-30 youth and for our high school youth 15-20 youth. As adult leaders working together we are able to offer more events, service and learning experiences and retreats and trips because we are able to share our time and skills.
