#### <u>Sunday Adult Education – Have You Ever</u> <u>Wondered?</u>

We're taking a break in December. Join in the other activites at 9:45am on Sunday mornings!

#### Coming in January: Have You Ever Wondered?

The class decided to continue our conversation about refugees for a couple more weeks. We would like to figure out ways to help. Some want to purchase needed items. Some want to advocate. Some want

to interact directly with refugees perhaps to tutor or pick up from the airport. Join the conversation on **Jan. 2 and 9** in the Fellowship Room at 9:45 am.

Then like last year, we will begin our new year of learning, by studying the Gospel assigned to Year C in the lectionary. That is the Gospel of Luke. Our Lectionary Cycle, that calendar by which our readings come, is three years in length. Each year focuses on one Gospel (Matthew, Mark and Luke) with John's Gospel used for high holy days such as Christmas Eve or Easter. Thus, we will dig into Luke and see what the unique characteristics of his Gospel are.

Here is a teaser.... Unlike the other Gospels, which jump right into the story of Jesus, Luke takes the very first four verses to explain why he is writing his book. We see right away; this Gospel is written for and to a particular person named Theophilus ('lover of God' or 'one whom God loves').

<sup>1</sup>Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, <sup>2</sup>just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, <sup>3</sup>I too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, <sup>4</sup>so that you may know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed.

Luke wants his reader, Theophilus, to be fortified or strengthened by this particular story which is about to be told. In Luke we read the most details about Jesus' childhood and young life. Only in Luke is the parable of the Good Samaritan included. Mary sings her heart out in the Magnificat. Intrigued? You don't have to know it all. Just come and learn with everyone else! *Pastor Ruth Ann*
