<u>Sunday Adult Education – "Have You Ever Wondered?"</u> 9:45am on Sunday mornings!

We are diving into Luke's Gospel, our Gospel text for preaching in 2022, Year C of the Lectionary. Just as we did with Mark, we will study themes, characteristics, and motivations of Luke to write the Gospel he did.

Here is a teaser.... Unlike the other Gospels, which jump right into the story of Jesus, Luke takes the very first four verses to explain why he is writing his book. We see right away; this Gospel is written for and to a particular person named Theophilus ('lover of God' or 'one whom God loves').

¹Since many have undertaken to set down an orderly account of the events that have been fulfilled among us, ²just as they were handed on to us by those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and servants of the word, ³I too decided, after investigating everything carefully from the very first, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, ⁴so that you may

know the truth concerning the things about which you have been instructed.

Luke wants his reader, Theophilus, to be fortified or strengthened by this particular story which is about to be told. In Luke we read the most details about Jesus' childhood and young life. You don't have to know it all. Just come and learn with everyone else! Pastor Ruth Ann

40 Days of Giving Begin on Ash Wednesday, March 2!

For nearly two years, as the world has reeled from the effects of a deadly pandemic, we have seen the number of hungry people rise sharply, watched as food pantries and soup kitchens expanded to serve an ever-growing number of guests, and longed together in hope for the time "when [we] will hunger no more and thirst no more...and God will wipe away every tear from [our] eyes." Marty Mouse and Martin Luther

Hello everyone! I hope you are staying warm as God blesses us with snowy moisture. It certainly has been good to see you back in the building worshipping. Oh my, was Christmas Eve fab, fab, fabulous! You're doing a fantastic job wearing those masks to keep each other safe. They haven't perfected mouse masks yet, but you can trust, I'm staying my distance.

In case you didn't know, Martin
Luther lived through the Bubonic Plague. Its initial
outbreak began in 1348. This plague took the lives
of around one-third the population of Europe's
population in the Late Middle Ages and into the
Early Modern Period.

The plague struck Wittenberg in 1527. Luther wrote about this experience in a treatise, "Whether One May Flee from a Deadly Plague." He gives some very practical advice to Christians.

"Now if a deadly epidemic strikes, we should stay where we are, make our preparations, and take courage in the fact that we are mutually bound together...so that we cannot desert one another or flee from one another. First, we can be sure that God's punishment has come upon us, not only to chastise us for our sins but also to test our faith and love—our faith in that we may see and experience how we should act toward God: our love in that we may recognize how we should act toward our neighbor."

We as 21st Century Christians understand God's wrath and punishment differently from Luther in terms of God's punishment through a pandemic. Still his words about being bound together are still true. Our actions impact another's life.

'He also urges Christians to take the prescribed medicine available to them to decrease their chances of catching the virus as well as "fumigate," and "help purify the air." Interestingly, he strongly advises people to practice a type of "social distancing": "I shall avoid places and persons where my presence is not needed in order not to become contaminated and thus perchance infect and pollute others, and so cause their death by my negligence." Consider how your actions may impact another person's life and their chances of getting sick. I'll talk to you again later. Until then, I'm going back to my armchair and some cheese quiche!

King of Glory was contacted by a person wanting to sell burial plots within the historic section of Loveland Burial Park:

"There are three burial plots (sites 1,2,3) available for sale in Bloc 32, Lot 50 in the historic section of the Loveland Burial Park. Side-by-side plots are very difficult to find in the park, especially in the historic section which permits upright grave markers. Each plot can accommodate up to one casket and 6 cremains. The burial park is currently offering individual plots for \$2,000.00. These three plots are being offered for \$1900.00 each and can be sold as a unit or individually. There is a fee of \$100 per transaction which I as seller would cover. I am also happy to donate \$100 per transaction to your church."
