

Planting Guide for Trees

- 1. Dig hole twice as wide as the root ball/container and 6" deeper.
- 2. Backfill the hole and tamp soil beneath the root ball.
- 3. Set the tree in hole making sure the root ball is not below ground level.
- 4. On container grown trees, separate roots to prevent them from growing in a circle.
- 5. On Ball and Burlap trees cut all strings and open the top of the burlap.
- 6. Fill the hole. Be sure all burlap is covered with soil and tamp lightly. We recommend using Myke Tree and Shrub Transplanter to encourage healthy root development.
- 7. Use extra soil to build dike around the tree to hold water.
- 8. Water thoroughly. We recommend adding Fertilome Root Stimulator to promote root development and reduce transplant shock.
- 9. Wrap trunk to protect bark on fall planting.
- 10. Stake tree and maintain stakes for one year to assure correct growth. Run wires through rubber hose to protect bark.
- 11. Apply mulch to retain moisture and prevent grass root competition. Apply 2"-3" of organic mulch, holding it away from the stem of plant.
- 12. Use Fertilome Root Stimulator for the first three waterings to continue to promote healthy root and plant growth.
