Identity and Age – Provide One (1) Document

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Your identity documents must match your current legal name:

- It must include your suffix (example: “Mrs.” and “Jr.”) if it’s apart of your current legal name; and
- It may include, omit or abbreviate your middle name.
- SAVE is the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Program
- All documents must be unexpired and valid. Effective June 26th, 2018: Revised rule 18.19.5.15 NMAC provides that the documents listed below are acceptable as proof of lawful identity and age for non-commercial driver authorization card and identification cards not intended for federal purposes after October 1st, 2020.

DOCUMENTS WITH NO FINGER PRINT REQUIRED

- Original or certified copy of a birth certificate filed with a state office of vital statistics or equivalent agency in the individuals place of birth.
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the US Department of State, Form FS240, DS-1350 or FS-545 Pay Stub Proof (with full name and SSN).
- Unexpired Employment Authorization document issued by the US Department of Homeland Security, form I-766 or form I-688B, verified by SAVE.
- Affidavit of Indian Birth.
- N560 Certificate of Citizenship, if verified in SAVE.
- N550 Certificate of Naturalization, if verified in SAVE.
- Valid Permanent Resident card issued by the U.S. government, if verified in SAVE.
- Valid I-551 resident alien card, issued since 1997, if verified in SAVE.
- Valid New Mexico license or ID card.
- I-94 form presented without passport if it contains the applicants photo, if verified in SAVE.
- Passport or Passport card from the US if verified through SAVE.

DOCUMENTS WITH FINGER PRINT REQUIRED

- Identification card issued by the consulate of Mexico in El Paso Texas, Albuquerque New Mexico, or such other foreign consulate.
- Certified Letter of Enrollment issued by a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe, or pueblo.
- Valid Identification card issued by a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe, or pueblo.
- Certified copy of foreign birth certificate, with a notarized English translation if not in English.
- State issued driver’s license, driver’s license issued by a U.S. Territory, or by jurisdiction of Canada, with photograph and has not been expired more than a year.
- State government-issued photo ID card, or photo ID card issued by U.S. Territory, or by jurisdiction of Canada, with photograph and has not been expired more than a year.
- A state government issued learners permit, or a learner’s permit issued by a territory of the US, or by a jurisdiction of Canada, with photograph and has not been expired more than a year.
- American Indian or Alaskan proof of Indian blood, certificate of degree of Indian blood, federal Indian census card or tribal membership card.
- Photo ID card issued by the U.S. Military, U.S. Coast Guard or New Mexico National Guard.
- ID document issued by the U.S. Veterans Administration, so long as it is accompanied by a U.S. Veterans Administration medical center identification card.
- U.S. active duty/retiree/reservist military ID card (DOD ID DD-2).
- U.S., state, or local government-issued photo ID, issued based on name, social security number and date of birth if not expired more than a year.
- Court order for name change, gender change, adoption or divorce, as long as it includes the legal name, date of birth, and court seal
- New Mexico Corrections Department photo identification card, or a photo identification card issued by the Federal Bureau of Prisons, that includes name, date of birth, and documentation that the card has not expired within the past year.
- Social Security card or other document from the SSA with the applicant’s name and social security number.
- DD-214 Military Discharge or Separation papers.
- Selective Service card.
- Military dependent identification card that includes the applicants photo.
- Medical insurance card or documentation of medical insurance coverage or eligibility containing an insurance identification number including a Medicaid or Medicare card.
- Passport or Passport card from the applicant’s country of citizenship, if verified in SAVE.
- Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN).
- Medical record less than 1 year old that is not from Emergency room or Urgent Care facility.
- Proof of eligibility for and receipt of welfare benefits, including general assistance, temporary assistance for needy families and the supplemental nutrition assistance program with a copy of the Human Services Department profile page dated within the last year.

New Mexico Residency Provide Two (2) Documents

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Your New Mexico Residency Documents must match your current legal name:

- It must include the suffix (example: Mrs.” and “Jr.”) if it is apart of your current legal name; and
- It may include, omit or abbreviate your middle name.

Documents Dated within 60 Days

- ▶ Utility Bill (no cell phone bill statements are accepted)
- ▶ Bank or Credit Card Statement
- ▶ Pay Stub
- ▶ Education Institution Document (Transcript, Report Card, or Enrollment)
- ▶ City, Country, State, Tribal, or Federal Document Attesting to having Residency in New Mexico.

Documents Dated within 6 months

- ▶ Local Property Tax Statement
- ▶ Mortgage Statement
- ▶ Insurance Bill, Card, or Binder

Documents with Current Date (not expired):

- ▶ Real Property Rental or Purchase Agreement
- ▶ New Mexico Public Assistance or Medical Card, letter or printout
- ▶ Membership in a New Mexico Religious or Sports Organization Document (if under age 18 only)
- ▶ Affidavit of New Mexico Residency (if under age 18 only) | Print and Fill Out: MVD 10021 | Download Form

The selected documents must list your New Mexico physical residential address. HC and P.O. boxes cannot be accepted.

Printed paperless bill statements are accepted.

Proof of Identity

SAVE (Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Program) – The SAVE Program provides a fast, secure and efficient verification service for federal, state and local benefit-granting agencies to verify a benefit applicant's immigration status or naturalized/derived citizenship. SAVE is administered by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, a component of the Department of Homeland Security, and is dedicated to providing program support to participating agencies. New Mexico Vital Records – For an original or certified copy of a birth record, contact the Department of Health (DOH), New Mexico Vital Records website at <https://nmhealth.org/about/erd/bvrhs/vrp/>. Approximate cost per copy is \$10.00. Expedited services are available at an additional cost.

Marriage and Divorce – For an original or certified copy of a marriage license or divorce decree, contact the county clerk's office in the county where the marriage license or divorce decree was issued.

Verification of Lawful Status (VLS) – Immigration documents are matched by the MVD to the records found in the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) system.
