Please see the questions that follow as a guide. Trust that the questions you come up with, as well as the questions of those in your group, are very likely superior to what follows. Use them if they're useful, but please feel no pressure to treat them as a script!

## **Group Questions:**

- What questions did Adam's message stir up for you?
- What stands out to you about Zechariah and Elizabeth?
  - What left you inspired?
  - What left you confused?
- When considering questions like: How you spend your money?, What do you laugh at?, What makes you angry?, Who are your heroes?, and How you spend your free time?, what themes emerge as it relates to your actual framing narrative?
- How is your actual everyday framing narrative different from your aspirational framing narrative?
- How are you hoping this season of Advent observance can impact your ability to live out your desired framing narrative?
- What are you waiting for? What are the tangible opportunities in your life to build your identity around one waiting for God?
- How might it help you think about times in the past when you waited and God did prove trustworthy? Care to share a story?
- What can we do to make our waiting on God an action, not just a thought?
