WHAT DOES A CNA DO?

Nursing assistants, sometimes called Nurse Aides or CNA, provide basic care and help with activities of daily living. Nurse Aides are often the primary caregivers. CNA's generally work directly under the supervision of a Registered Nurse (RN). Often the CNA has more direct contact with the individual patient than doctors, specialists, nurses or other members of the staff due to the fact that the CNA is responsible for direct patient care and patient's need.

CNA's Typically Do The Following:

- · Clean, bathe and dress patients
- · Serve meals and help patients eat
- Turn or reposition bedridden patients
- Lift patients in to beds, wheelchairs, exam tables, etc...
- Measure and record vital signs, such as pulse, blood pressure, respirations and temperature
- Listen to and record patients health concerns and report that information to other members of healthcare team
