





CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

BASKET WEAVING

Customarily woven by women, the Agaseke craft is known for its impressive quality, beauty, and cultural importance. The Agaseke basket is traditionally given by mothers to their daughters during marriage ceremonies.

LOCAL HOME STAY & COOKING LESSON

Spend the night with a Rwandan family and enjoy local food that you will help to prepare! After dinner, listen to stories and experience how people live in the village.

BANANA BEER PRODUCTION

Get to work smashing bananas and grinding sorghum grain to help make this traditional local beverage. Afterwards, enjoy some delicious bannana beer with the local women.

AGRICULTURAL TOUR

Experience a day in the life of Rwandan family, waking up early to feed the animals followed by planting or harvesting local crops. After a work-filled morning, relax in the shade with the family and refresh with a snack.

POTTERY MAKING

Traditional cookware is made with brown volcanic clays and then carefully dried. Learn about the process of traditional pottery making and try your hand at crafting your own piece!

OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

TWIN LAKES TOUR

Lakes Burera & Ruhondo are twin lakes located adjacent to active volcanoes. The tour includes a boat ride and a visit with one of the island communities which boasts fantastic views of the volcanoes. Camping on an island can also be arranged!

MOUNTAIN HIKE TO RUGALIKA
