Discussed at length need to formally make policy some current actions and informal policies. Preschool director to amend handbooks to reflect these informal policies, and formalize current processes. Director's reports entered into the minutes.

3. Mosaica Report

Parent surveys being collated, New TPAAK "Summer Menu" for teachers to do, for extra income during the summer. Lots of nifty things being offered including STEM, arts and other attractive options for summer camp-like activities for students during the break. E-learning days will be included in next year's calendar to acquaint students with these options used in many schools now

and in the future. Looking at a \$300 Excel Energy fee to do an energy audit of the building to find ways to save on utilities, awaiting an exact quote. Enrollment is currently ahead of this year's numbers. Announcements have gone out for the India student exchange program for June. Our school academic results for last year are the best in the history of the school, we're moving in the right direction! Mosaica and CAO reports entered into the minutes.

CAO found many classes found to be having extra recess instead of Paragon at the end of one day surveyed, CAO has addressed this apparent lapse with the faculty. Handbook needs to be revised to include smart phones as well as "pagers and Walkmans" not allowed in use at the school. Smart phones are still covered under "other electronic devices" currently.
