1. Mosaica and HoS Report

CSI Dashboard – noncompliance issues – have we corrected these areas? Some have been corrected and some are in progress.

USIP – to be presented to Board for approval? USIP reports are in progress.

Brian (IT) is working Scantron fixes to give longer timeouts. Discussed new state standards and how personalized performance/achievement sets are planned and tested. Looking at adding typing instruction for students sooner (Mavis Beacon).

2. **Preschool** – oversight – update

Roger looks at funds. Revenue is up, but income is only 50% of last year's net. Need to implement budget constraints and analyze numbers. Discussed adding third room and that budget. Got information from Shanda, but needs to be put into more usable planning format.




