Assessment and Data

BOY Dibels

We are entering the 19-20 school year with the same percentage of students at or above benchmark as the 18-19 school year (59%), though we do have less students with a significant reading deficit (28% entering the 18-19 school year, 24% this year). We started our first cycle of Burst interventions last week, and all students who tested below benchmark and well below benchmark are receiving targeted interventions at their level, in addition to some students who may be at benchmark but have some areas of deficit (i.e. fluency, comprehension). Teachers have also worked on grade level plans during data meetings to address gaps they are seeing with their new students, both from end of year data last year and this year's new data. Several teachers are running their own Burst groups during intervention time for students who might be at benchmark, but need a little extra to support their growth. See attached for Dibels grade breakdown and comparisons to last year.

MAP Projected Proficiency

The MAP test projects students' proficiency on CMAS. Below is a comparison on how MAP projected our 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders to perform on CMAS last year, and how they actually performed. Except for 3rd grade reading, the MAP projections were lower than how students actually performed. After this year's BOY MAP testing, projections are overall lower than last year, so hopefully we will again out-perform the projections. Attached are the project reports.

Admin Feedback/Evaluation

The admin will then discuss as a team and then present the staff with the areas that we are working on as individual professionals and as a school as a whole. This info will also be shared with the board. This idea was generated by our team leads to help open up communication between staff and admin.

Professional Development

- Claudia attended a two-day PBIS training with the PBIS team (4 team leads), and this week they are rolling out a lot of positive school culture ideas. More information to come in the following months on the progress of the program.
- The September 20 Mental Health First Aid training from Dr. Shannon Devlin had to be canceled. Teachers had some team planning time and worked on curriculum scope and sequence for the year.

Facilities

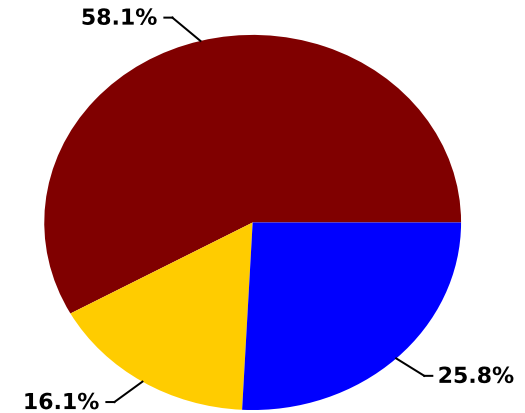
