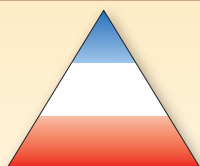

Together Time Activities

Here are some fun activities you and your child can enjoy together!

• Discover Pretty Places

If possible, take your child to visit a nearby scenic area. You could also plan an imaginary trip to a national park! Visit nps.gov and explore things to see and do. Which ones look best to you?

• Watch Fish

Visit a pet store and watch the fish. Help your child notice the colors and ways the fish move.

• Barefoot in the Grass

Let your child walk barefoot in the grass! Find a grassy area without sticks, stones, or other obstacles. As your child explores, talk about how the grass looks, smells, and feels.

• Make Bubbles

Make your own bubble solution! Gently mix $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water, $\frac{1}{4}$ cup dish detergent (Joy, Dawn, etc.) and 1 tablespoon light corn syrup. Use anything with holes as bubble wands.



Nursery Rhymes

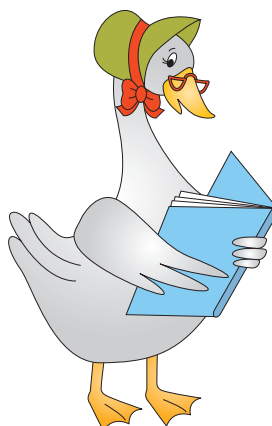

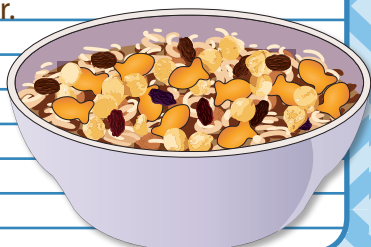
Cooking Together

When cooking with infants and toddlers, allow them to help in a safe way with mixing, pouring, rolling, mashing, shaking, etc. Use words to describe what you are doing and what you plan to do next. Talk about what you see, smell, feel, hear, and taste.

Trail Mix

- 1 cup oat ring cereal
- 1 cup small fish-shaped crackers
- 1 cup cinnamon toast flavored cereal
- 1 cup bite-size shredded wheat
- ½ cup butterscotch chips
- ½ cup raisins

Mix all ingredients in a bowl. Add more nibbles or make substitutions if you like! Divide into individual portions to carry on a hike or when riding in the car.
